Some Questions to Discuss

- 1. Why has Hosea 3:1 been called the theme verse of the entire book?

- 2. What is "idolatry?"
- 3. What forms of idolatry were God's people guilty of in Hosea's day? What forms do we tend to engage in today?
- 4. What are some of the ways you see God's relentless love pursuing his wayward people in this text?
- 4. What is the dominant "tone" of the text judgment, mercy, or both?
- 5. How does the Gospel ultimately resolve the tension between the justice of God and the grace of God?

Some Things to Pray About

- 1. For vibrant, joyful, and challenging times of gathered worship on Sunday mornings
- 2. For the fruitful ministry of the word in Sunday School, morning worship, men's and women's studies, and youth fellowship
