B Corporate Confession of Faith

- Q. Which is the first commandment?
- A. The first commandment is, You shall have no other gods before me.
- Q. What is required in the first commandment?
- A. The first commandment requires us to know and acknowledge God to be the only true God; and to worship and glorify him accordingly.
- Q. What is forbidden in the first commandment?
- A. The first commandment forbids the denying, or not worshipping and glorifying, the true God as God, and our God; and the giving of that worship and glory to any other, which is due to him alone.
- Q. What are we specially taught by these words, before me, in the first commandment?
- A. These words, before me, in the first commandment teach us, that God, who sees all things, takes notice of, and is much displeased with, the sin of having any other God.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism is a catechism written in 1646 and 1647 by the Westminster Assembly, a synod of English and Scottish theologians and laymen intended to bring the Church of England into greater conformity with the Church of Scotland.

The purpose of the Shorter Catechism is to educate people in the basic doctrines of the Reformed faith.

2) In what ways have you been overwhelmed by Jesus?


3) What evidences of transformation do you see in Saul's life after this encounter (either in this passage or the rest of Scripture)?
